

## People living in boarding houses

### About the Census

Every five years, the Australian Bureau of Statistics counts every person and household in Australia. This is called the Census of Population and Housing. This year, the Census is on **Tuesday 10 August**.

**Your participation in the Census is important.** Census data is used to plan and fund services to assist people experiencing homelessness or a housing crisis. This includes emergency shelters for individuals and families, support for people experiencing domestic violence and transitional housing.

### How to complete your Census

**Everyone staying in a boarding house on Census night, Tuesday 10 August, needs to complete a Census form.**

Each person staying in this accommodation on Census night will receive a pink Census form. This form will be supplied by your accommodation provider.

You can also complete your Census online using the log in details on the front of the paper form provided.

How to answer the question **'Where does the person usually live?'**

- If a homelessness agency has organised and paid for you to stay in a boarding house, write **'NONE-CRISIS'** under suburb. If you complete your form online, include the state and postcode of the address you are staying at on Census night.
- **If you live in the boarding house long term** use the boarding house address as your usual address.

### Your personal information is protected

The personal information you provide in your Census is protected by law and isn't shared with anyone. This includes other government agencies such as the police, Centrelink or housing office. You can't be identified by the information you share about yourself and your family in your Census. **10 Where does the person usually live?**

- For people who usually live in another country and who are visiting Australia for less than one year, mark 'Other country'.
- For other people, 'usually live' means the address at which the person has lived, or intends to live, for a total of six months or more in 2021.
- For people who have no fixed or return address (for example, due to family conflict or eviction), write 'NONE' in the 'Suburb/Locality' box.
- For boarders at boarding school, write the address of the boarding school or college.
