

People staying in brokered temporary accommodation (vouchers/emergency)

This information is for people staying in temporary accommodation (such as a hotel, motel, caravan park or backpackers) organised and fully or partially paid for by a housing or homelessness service provider.

About the Census

Every five years, the Australian Bureau of Statistics counts every person and household in Australia. This is called the Census of Population and Housing. This year, the Census is on **Tuesday 10 August**.

Your participation in the Census is important. Census data is used to plan services for the community including healthcare, schools and transport. It's also used to plan and fund services to assist people experiencing homelessness or a housing crisis. This includes emergency shelters for individuals and families, support for people experiencing domestic violence and transitional housing.

How to complete your Census

Each person staying in brokered temporary accommodation on Census night will receive a pink Census Form. This form will be supplied by your accommodation provider. You can also complete your Census online using the log in details on the front of the paper form.

For the question 'Where does the person usually live?' write **'NONE – CRISIS'** under suburb. If you complete your form online, include the state and postcode of the address you are staying at on Census night.

Answering the question like this ensures your housing situation is counted the right way. The Census can then provide an accurate picture of how many people are experiencing homelessness on Census night.

Your personal information is protected

The personal information you provide in your Census is protected by law and isn't shared with anyone. This includes other government agencies such as the police, Centrelink or housing office. You can't be identified by the information you share about yourself and your family in your Census. More information can be found at www.census.abs.gov.au/privacy

10 Where does the person usually live?

- For people who usually live in another country and who are visiting Australia for less than one year, mark 'Other country'.
- For other people, 'usually live' means the address at which the person has lived, or intends to live, for a total of six months or more in 2021.
- For people who have no fixed or return address (for example, due to family conflict or eviction), write 'NONE' in the 'Suburb/Locality' box.
- For boarders at boarding school, write the address of the boarding school or college.
